- Identify risks to marine safety, health and safety of employees, contractors, the public and the environment ensuring they are assessed and mitigated to prevent injury and / or ill health, environmental harm and consider what we can do to conserve & enhance biodiversity.
- Develop objectives and specify projects to exploit opportunities, control identified risks and monitor performance through oversight by appropriate committees, sub-committees, and panels.
- Provide the resources required to deliver our services and objectives effectively, safely, within budget and on time.
- Maintain compliance with relevant legislation and other requirements the organisation subscribes to.
- Continually improve the performance of our integrated management system to enhance environmental and safety performance, maintain customer satisfaction and further develop our business processes through external and internal audit, supported by a proactive approach to process development.
- Review and update our Marine Safety, Quality, Health & Safety, Environmental & sustainability objectives annually to ensure continued legal compliance, customer, and stakeholder satisfaction.
- Ensure data is valued and well managed throughout the organisation to aid in monitoring objectives, identifying improvements, and managing risks.
- Continually improve our Integrated Management System and *Marine Safety Management System* in accordance with relevant international standards BS ISO 9001:2015 – Quality, BS ISO 45001:2018 – Health & Safety, BS ISO 14001:2015 – Environment and the *Ports & Marine Facilities Safety Code 2025* and continue to externally certify the FPS IMS with NQA.
- Communicate this policy to our employees, customers, stakeholders, and all persons acting on behalf of FHC.
- Provide information about our performance based on quantifiable objectives.
